1. ASSESSMENT DOMAIN

PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT

This project deals with the construction of a comprehensive health centre to enable delivery of good quality health care and to potentially improve quality and range of health care provided at the rural area. The project primary purpose is to accommodate the student at the College of Health Science and Technology for practical and extend health care services delivery to the community.
